PROGRAM IMPACT UPDATE HONORING OUR WARRIORS, SUPPORTING THEIR FAMILIES

WARRIOR & FAMILY SUPPORT

This month the Navy SEAL Foundation received and responded to **35 Warrior and Family Support requests** for active-duty Naval Special Warfare (NSW) members, including logistical **family support** and necessary **rehabilitation equipment**. Of these requests, 17 of them were in support of SEALs, three were in support of SWCCs and 15 were in support of NSW enablers assigned to NSW commands.

In one case, an active-duty SEAL was injured while conducting training in Niland, CA. He sustained a **gunshot wound** to his back and shoulder, the shell entered his upper right back and struck bone, then exited near his right clavicle. The Foundation provided travel for this SEAL's family members, enabling them to be by his side and **assist him in his recovery**.

In another instance, an active-duty SEAL was conducting mission training off the coast of California when a large swell struck the small craft that he was commanding. The front windshield of the vessel dislodged, **striking him in the head and knocked him unconscious**. The service member **was treated for traumatic brain injury (TBI)** along with other injuries sustained at the time. Since this accident, this SEAL has undergone **multiple surgeries** to address his injuries. The Navy SEAL Foundation is working to continue our support for him as needed throughout his recovery.

The Navy SEAL Foundation's family support extends to the children of active-duty NSW servicemembers as well as their

spouses. When difficult circumstances arise, we are ready and willing to help. This month, we provided needed travel support for an active-duty SEAL whose child was born with a cyst on their liver. The child required immediate treatment with the possibility of future surgery. This travel and lodging assistance kept the family together during their child's recovery and alleviated a financial burden, reducing stress at an already stressful and emotional time.

On August 22nd, the Chief of Naval Operations, Admiral John M. Richardson, presided over an award ceremony at SEAL Team ONE in Coronado. It was our pleasure to support travel and lodging for family members of those receiving awards at this special event.

Other warrior and family support included food and childcare for several Chief Selectee events, supporting our NSW commands as they recognized this milestone achievement!

The Foundation's annual Princess and Her Frog Dance in Hawaii was a beautiful affair, with 48 princesses and 35 fathers attending. The venue, at the base of the Ko'olau Mountain range, was the perfect setting for this magical night. The dance was the 4th event held for our NSW fathers and daughters stationed in Hawaii at SEAL Delivery Vehicle Team ONE.

As NSW's footprint grows, so do our programs, and the Princess and Her Frog Dance is one event where this is evident. Our NSW families stationed in Germany will have their first dance next month and our families stationed in Stennis, Mississippi,

were treated to their very first Princess and Her Frog Dance at the beginning of this month. The turnout was excellent, and everyone was so appreciative.

It is such a delight to witness these daughters enter the "ballroom" with their fathers, and their gratitude to the Foundation and our donors who make events like these possible is so very special. It is such an honor to provide opportunities like this for fathers and daughters to bond!

One universal question that many injured service members face is, "How do I create and cultivate meaning in my life?" This climb helps them answer that question by demonstrating that one of the most effective ways to find value is to create it personally.

Those participating inscribed the names of their fallen comrades on United States flags and carried them to the top of the mountain. The ascent of the mountain is a perfect metaphor for conquering challenges many veterans face. Thev Navy SEAL Foundation was honored to support this mission!

This beautful space was made possible by our partnership with Alexandria Real Estate Equities, Inc. and it will allow THF to transform even more lives, giving our special operators a distinct advantage as they transition out of active service and into the civilian sector.

VETERANS SUPPORT

This month as part of our Veteran Support programs the Navy SEAL Foundation assisted a veteran SEAL with severe orthopedic complications caused by numerous deployments and documented hard landings in military aircraft. This retired service member's issues are many; he has severe pain in his back, shoulders, and head. 
