PROGRAM IMPACT UPDATE

WOUNDED, ILL & INJURED SUPPORT

This month, NSF supported 56 wounded, ill and injured requests (32 SEAL, 5 SWCC, 10 Support and 9 Retired) which included logistical family support, necessary rehabilitation equipment, veteran medical support for combat sustained injuries, casualty checks, medical board stipends, respite childcare, and other financial assistance.



An active-duty SEAL was injured during training and sustained extreme compound and bilateral fractures in both his tibia and fibula. The trauma to his ankle has required him to undergo six reconstructive surgeries to rebuild the tibia, fibula, and ankle, which was eventually fused. Because of these injuries, the service member required a new footplate to maintain his status as deployable. NSF provided funding to supplement the cost of this device thus allowing him to deploy as scheduled.

Our Warrior & Family Support programs also include support for caregivers of injured service members. We realize that many times our warriors need someone with them to manage the day to day things while they heal. Often, that person is a parent. The Foundation's support alleviates the financial burden of travel costs and even childcare in some cases.

An active-duty SEAL recently suffered severe combat wounds when he was struck by an IED in Syria. He is currently receiving care in a CONUS military treatment facility, and the Foundation has provided him with a casualty assistance check to offset any immediate financial needs. We also provided travel support to his parents so they could be by his side as he recovers. NSF Programs staff has briefed the service member's spouse on our wounded support programs, and we are standing by to assist with future needs.


In October 2009, an active-duty SEAL suffered a traumatic brain injury (TBI) as well as substantial wounds to his face. Shrapnel from the blast penetrated his skull and is located in an area of his brain that is inoperable. Because of his injuries, this warrior has been placed on a Temporary Disability Retired List awaiting a further disability review by the Navy. While in this 'holding pattern' with the Navy, service members

lose their special pays which can create financial hardship for their families. As this SEAL and his family await a final ruling on his medical retirement, NSF is providing financial assistance to supplement the lost pays and alleviate financial hardship.

Our programs alleviate many stressors that are inherent to life in NSW, and we work hand-



Additionally, this month NSF supported the family of an active-duty warrior whose spouse underwent an organ transplant. We provided travel assistance and lodging for the warrior so he could be with his wife while she was hospitalized. We will also provide travel assistance for extended family members who will be caring for the spouse when the service member deploys.





WARRIOR TRANSITION

This month NSF supported 17 NSW members (14 SEAL, 2 SWCC, 1 Enabler) with Transition services. Our support included travel assistance to events including Elite Meet Seattle. We also fulfilled multiple inquiries for transition information. NSF continues to educate the NSW community regarding transition resources. In the coming month, our Transition Advisor will be visiting NSWG-3 in Hawaii in support of the OCONUS community. This visit will include an educational transition information session for Command members and their spouses.

WARRIOR & FAMILY SUPPORT

NSF supported 22 requests (14 SEAL, 1 SWCC, and 7 Support) for NSW Warriors and their families under our Warrior & Family Support pillar. Some examples of this type of support include respite childcare during hospital stays or recovery periods, flights for family members who will serve as caregivers for an injured service member, and meal prep or home care to ensure the family maintains the necessary quality of life to facilitate a successful recovery. These programs make a real difference in the lives of those we support.

Members of the audience were moved to tears as he shared how his children coped and how proud he was of their strength and courage.

"Our warriors are indispensable to the defense of our nation. The sacrifices their families make are an indispensable part of the mission, and the Navy SEAL Foundation's support to those families is impossible to quantify or overestimate," said Harward before thanking the audience for their support.

The 2019 Navy SEAL Foundation New York City Benefit Dinner is scheduled for March 7, 2019.
























