THE SITUATION REPORT

PROGRAM SUPPORT UPDATES

ACTIVE DUTY WOUNDED, ILL AND INJURED SUPPORT

This month the Navy SEAL Foundation supported **48 wounded, ill and injured requests** which included logistical family support, required rehabilitation equipment, veteran medical support for combat sustained injuries, casualty checks, medical board stipend support, respite child care, and other financial assistance.

While deployed to Iraq, an active-duty SEAL was **critically injured in a vehicle roll-over accident**. NSF, in collaboration with the USSOCOM Care Coalition Advocates, reacted within hours of notification to provide travel to Landstuhl, Germany for the service member's mother, wife, and three-year-old daughter. This enabled the family to get to his bedside and travel with the member from Landstuhl to Walter Reed where he continues to receive care. Once the member arrived at Walter Reed, the NSF provided travel for the member's father and sister.

This month we also provided creative transportation solutions with ride-sharing applications to a service member whose driver's license was revoked due to a service-connected injury. **The medically retired service member experiences ongoing seizures due to an injury he sustained during Close Quarters Combat (CQC) while in SEAL Qualification Training (SQT)**. As a result of his injuries, he suffers from debilitating and life-altering seizures. Because of our assistance he is now empowered to complete daily and routine activities without relying on family members for transportation.

WARRIOR AND FAMILY SUPPORT

NSF supported **18 support requests** for Naval Special Warfare Warriors and their families this month. We continue to support an NSW couple whose infant was born with special medical needs related to a genetic disorder. As the active duty SEAL returns to a deployable status and prepares to be commissioned as a SEAL officer, **NSF is providing respite child care and travel assistance to his immediate family members who are assisting the family**. This support is integral in keeping the service member in an operational status.

WARRIOR TRANSITION

NSF is currently supporting **146 NSW personnel within the SET Pipeline** and this month, 14 new requests for transition support were received.

NSF's Transition Advisor, Mike Turkenkopf, recently presented a brief on [SET](#) to the NSW Enlisted and Officer Community Managers and Detailers during their semi-annual meeting with East Coast command leaders.

NSF also facilitated an unprecedented number of applications by transitioning NSW members for [Dartmouth's Tuck Next Step \(TNS\)-Transition to Business](#) program's next cohort.

This month the Navy SEAL Foundation hosted our yearly **Sibling Wellness Weekend** in Arizona. This impactful event brings together our Gold Star Surviving brothers and sisters for fellowship and healing in a safe and supportive environment.


