NSF EARNS CHARITY NAVIGATOR'S 4-STAR RATING FOR EIGHTH CONSECUTIVE YEAR!


We are so excited to share that the NSF has once again received a 4-Star rating from Charity Navigator, America's largest and most-referenced independent evaluator of national charities. In addition, NSF scored a perfect 100 on the charitable watchdog's ranking system for the fourth year in a row.

Michael A. Thatcher, Charity Navigator's President & CEO, informed the Foundation's management staff and board of directors about the eighth consecutive 4-Star rating, he also reported that the organization had achieved its

fourth consecutive perfect 100 score. According to Thatcher, just 4 percent of the more than 8,000 charities rated by Charity Navigator received the 4-Star designation eight consecutive times and only 67 charities had perfect scores this year, placing NSF in the top 0.8% of rated charities.

"Further, NSF scored a perfect '100' score among rated charities that place the Foundation in the 'Top 0.8 percent' of benevolent organizations. Ms. Robin King and her Team are phenomenal," Pybus said.

"Everyone associated with NSF can take pride in this recognition," said Robin King, chief executive officer. "It reflects well upon the volunteers, donors and staff working around the country on a daily basis and throughout the year to support the NSW community. Those families are what we're all about."

NAVY SEAL FOUNDATION, SEAL FAMILY FOUNDATION, SEAL LEGACY FOUNDATION, AND SEALKIDS CREATE HISTORIC AGREEMENT IN SUPPORT OF NSW CHILDREN

SEALKIDS, the SEAL Family Foundation (SFF), the Navy SEAL Foundation (NSF), and the SEAL Legacy Foundation (SLF) each serve the Navy Special Warfare community but have distinct missions and areas of expertise. One common area where all four agencies overlap involves fostering the academic success and well-being of children of NSW operators. On January 1 of this year, the four groups began a collaboration agreement to better achieve that common goal.

Under the new partnership, Mooresville, N.C.-based SEALKIDS will continue its primary mission to provide testing and evaluation, advocacy, academic, and specialized needs support to children of NSW families. As of January 1, SEALKIDS will act as the conduit through which all NSW children's academic support flows for the SFF, the NSF, and the SLF.

Our three organizations will provide financial support for SEALKIDS program services in the form of a grant that will provide operational stability and increase the reach of SEALKIDS in their efforts through an encompassing approach of academic testing, tutoring, therapy, advocacy, and enrichment to assist NSW children.

"By working together, our four organizations will grow the impact and reach of the SEALKIDS programs over the next 12 months









and potentially longer," according to Dr. Gretchen McIntosh, Executive Director of SEALKIDS. "Ultimately, the goal is to keep today's Navy SEAL in the fight," she said.

"We've joined forces in a way that focuses additional resources on this one aspect of NSW family life," said retired Navy Captain William R. Fenick, the Executive Director of the SEAL Family Foundation. "As the Founding Partner with SEALKIDS, we hope this combined effort achieves much more than what we have done in the past and could do separately."





Robin King, CEO of the Virginia Beach-based Navy SEAL Foundation echoed those sentiments. "We feel that leveraging our resources to tackle this common mission makes a lot of sense. It also demonstrates our collective responsibility to be good stewards of the donations we receive."

"Each partner in this effort is excited to combine their impact in fundamentally transforming the SEALKIDS experience for the NSW Community," said Mark McGinnis, managing director of SEAL Legacy Foundation which is located in Austin, Texas. "None of this is possible without the unique partnership that we hope continues to grow and strengthen over the years to come."

PARNERSHIP WITH SAN DIEGO FLEET



PROGRAM SUPPORT UPDATES

ACTIVE DUTY WOUNDED, ILL AND INJURED SUPPORT

This month, NSF supported **48 wounded, ill and injured requests** to include logistical family support, necessary rehabilitation equipment, veteran medical support for combat sustained injuries, casualty check, medical board stipend, respite childcare, and financial assistance. NSF frequently covers the costs of medical equipment that are not funded by TRICARE but are also deemed essential to healing and improved quality of life.

TRAGEDY ASSISTANCE AND SURVIVOR SUPPORT


On January 16, while serving on a diplomatic mission, former **SEAL Scott Wirtz** was killed in Syria by a suicide bomber. NSF provided tragedy assistance funding to his immediate family members. The Foundation also supported memorial remembrance items and travel and lodging for Scott's family and teammates to attend his

memorial and interment services held on February 5th and 6th in St. Louis.

Scott's family shared their gratitude with the NSF for the opportunity they were given to hear from his SEAL teammates about the adventures they shared with Scott when they were in a platoon together.



Additionally, NSF supported flights and hotel accommodations for NSW members to attend the memorial service for **CTIC Shannon Smith Kent**. Shannon was a well-respected former NSW enabler and who was killed alongside Scott Wirtz in Syria. NSF was honored to assist her previous NSW

WARRIOR AND FAMILY SUPPORT

NSF supported **18 requests for NSW warriors and their families**. Examples of support this month included respite child care, flights for service members and their families after the death of a family member, and flights for parents to visit their injured service member.

Additionally, the NSF supported when an active duty service member's infant was diagnosed with a **severe congenital heart defect** that required immediate surgery upon birth. We provided lodging and travel for the service member to be with her infant post-surgery and during recovery. We are beyond happy to report that the surgery went very well!



WARRIOR TRANSITION

This month, NSF received 8 new Transition Support requests. Our partners at The Honor Foundation began their Spring cohorts in both Virginia Beach and San Diego with a combined total of 51 NSW personnel participating. This is an increase of nearly 60% over this same period one year ago! The Honor Foundation is continuing to impact the NSW community in positive ways, and NSF is proud to be a Founding Partner!

So far in 2019, NSF has supported 17 transitioning NSW members as they attend Virginia High Performance as part of our SET program.

"I am so thankful to have met NSF's Transition Advisor at an Elite Meet event. It was through his hard work and support that I was introduced to the leadership team at Kill Cliff. From that meeting and sharing my story and future ambitions, they have agreed to accept my Fellowship as I transition out from service as well as offer me a position when I retire. The Navy SEAL Foundation has been by my family's side through the hardest of times and has followed us every step of the way. I could never express to you fully in words the depth of love and gratitude that we have for your amazing foundation. Thank you for all that you do, and I'm looking forward to working with a company that supports you."

This January the NSF and the National Navy UDT-SEAL Museum entered into a new partnership to ensure the continuation of our important legacy preservation initiatives for the NSW community. This agreement formalizes the process for our continuing mutual support of legacy preservation programs

for U.S. Navy SEALs and Special Warfare Combatant-Craft Crewmen (SWCC). It also reduces the duplication of programmatic efforts between our organizations and eliminates wasteful spending on overlapping services. Each year, NSF will provide \$140,000 in funds to the Museum to support legacy preservation initiatives such as monuments and history enrichment activities.

The Museum, located in Fort Pierce, Florida, was founded in 1985 and is dedicated to preserving the history of U.S. Navy SEALs, including their predecessors--Naval Combat Demolition Units (NCDU) and the Underwater Demolition Teams (UDT). The Navy SEAL Foundation, founded in 2000, has included Legacy Preservation as one of its core areas of support since its inception.

"This partnership emphasizes how important Legacy Preservation is for both organizations and why working together means so much to both of us and the NSW community," said Robin King, CEO of the Navy SEAL Foundation. "The new agreement allows both organizations to continue our efforts in a way that maximizes our impact for the community we serve."
